Maine Historic Building Record (MHBR No. 38)

The former Brunswick High School complex sits at the corner of Spring and McKen Streets in Brunswick, Maine. Constructed in 1938, the Art Deco style main building was designed by noted Maine architect, Harry S. Coombs. The later additions (1952 and 1961) were designed by Alonzo Harriman, another notable 20th century Maine architect.

In June 2008, the citizens of the Town of Brunswick approved the decommissioning and demolition of the former Brunswick High School in order to utilize the location for a new elementary school. Documentation of the complex was required to satisfy Section 106 of the National Preservation Act of 1966.

Sutherland Conservation & Consulting was retained by PDT Architects to research, write and assemble the documentation required by the Maine Historic Preservation Commission for the Maine Historic Building Record. This work included additional research into the history of the complex, identifying historic images, and preparing a detailed written narrative documenting the building's history, its significance and a thorough architectural description.
